Observations and Recommendations

Observations:

- Effective Mentoring Program: A structured Mentor-Mentee system is in place for the students.
 Students receive personalized guidance.
- 2. **Value-Added Programs**: All departments have designed and implemented value-added programs that align with course and program outcomes.
- 3. **Conducive Research Environment**: The college provides a conducive atmosphere for research among both faculty and students, which has resulted in research output.
- 4. **Dedicated Faculty**: The college has qualified faculty who are dedicated and serve with a strong sense of responsibility.
- 5. Adherence to NEP Structure: The college successfully implemented the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 in the academic year 2023-2024.
- 6. **High Satisfaction Levels**: Both teaching and non-teaching staff report a high level of satisfaction, indicating a healthy work environment.
- 7. **Active Alumni Involvement**: Alumni are actively involved in college activities at various levels contributing to the holistic development of current students.
- 8. **Examination and Assessment**: The college has a well-developed examination system, including separate servers for the smooth conduct of exams and open house sessions for students to verify their answer papers. Students are well informed about the exam pattern related to internal and external assessment.
- Welfare Initiatives: The college promotes inclusivity through initiatives like the Earn and Learn
 Scheme to assist economically disadvantaged students.
- 10. **Placement and Industry Connections**: The Placement Office of the college has developed strong ties with the industry, aiding in the placement and career progression of students.
- 11. Holistic Student-Centric Approach: The college follows UGC/NAAC-recommended methodologies like experiential and participative learning. Slow and advanced learners are identified early, and remedial and challenging programs are tailored to their needs.
- 12. **Library Services**: The library is well equipped with books, journals and online services. Library conducts various activities to promote reading habits among the students.

- 13. Incubation Center: The incubation center is active in promoting entrepreneurial skills and start-up development.
- 14. Management Contributions: The management provides seed money for research and development projects, encouraging innovation among students and faculty.

Recommendations:

- 1. Faculty Exchange Programs: It is recommended to explore faculty exchange programs to expose staff to different academic practices.
- 2. Continuous Curriculum Revamping: With the college's autonomy, the curriculum should be regularly reviewed and revamped to stay aligned with industry trends and evolving educational standards.
- 3. External Examination Intervention: For higher-level exams, such as Third Year (T.Y.) examinations, external intervention could be considered to ensure further rigor and transparency.
- 4. Need-Based Certificate Courses: More certificate courses, especially in high-demand areas, should be offered to improve students' employability.
- 5. Skill and language-based Courses: The college could consider offering additional value-added courses such as Sanskrit, Marathi language for non-Marathi speakers, translation courses and GIS (Geographical Information Systems)

6. Awards for Most Improved Students: Along with existing awards, the college should introduce a
