The Indian economy's biggest sectors

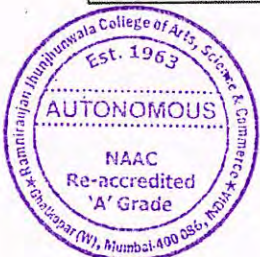
are at risk, as large-scale reverse migration of labour affected due to the lockdown. Because of which many sectors facing labour shortage at their workplace.
