

Shri. Yugal Kishor Joshi, Director, Jal Shakti Mission at Jal Shakti Mantralaya, Govt. of India, New Delhi was invited to give a keynote speech during the inaugural session. In his speech, he emphasized the need for proper conservation of valuable natural resources like water. To illustrate this, he summed up the well-known story of Satyakam Jabal and Gautam Rishi who was a famous saint. Humans have plundered the totality of natural resources and that is why serious environmental problems are plaguing the entire human race today. Citing the verses in the Upanishads, if we do not avoid the excess use of natural resources, the destruction of the environment in the near future will endanger the very existence of human beings. To conserve and protect the environment, he the need for emphasized participation in environmental conservation.

After this, the Dr. Kodarkar Memorial lecture was arranged in the memory of Late Dr. Kodarkar, who is a recognized lake researcher and scientist, is not only well known in India but also internationally. Shri. Ashish Loya was invited as guest speaker for this lecture.



Mr. Ashish Loya, a young man living in Bijnor, Uttar Pradesh, worked tirelessly with the help of local villagers to protect and conserve the vast wetland of Haiderpur near Hastinapur Sanctuary. This wetland ecosystem, rich in biodiversity and especially bird diversity, has recently been given the status of 'Ramsar Site'. Ashish Loya has contributed a lot to this. After living in the United States for 15 years, this highly educated young man returned to India and he became an active member of Sri Sri Ravi Shankar's Art of Living. Inspired by this, he set out to protect and nurture nature. He told the success story of all his journey's in this lecture.

After this, the Vice President of Paryavaran Dakshata Mandal, Dr. Sanjay Joshi briefed the about the awareness audience program, "Swachh Khadi Abhiyan" campaign of the organization. Since 1980s. heavy industrialization flourished and bloomed in surrounding areas of Thane Creek. Over the period, this created heavy pollution load on the waters of Thane Creek which ultimately led to deterioration in its ecological value. The ecological life and the water of Thane creek was badly impacted which led to decrease in aquatic life. This impacted the fishermen community which were dependent on Creek.

Now due to the closure of most industries along the creek, the pollution load was expected to be reduced but due to constant influx of people in the city and surrounding areas with subsequent developments of residential complexes the status of Creek remains unchanged. In such a fuss there was a need to conserve the Creek for which the "Swacch Khadi Abhiyaan" or "Clean creek Movement" was launched. For the past fifteen years Paryavaran Dakshata Mandal is running this campaign for spreading the awareness about the Creek among people. The main motto of starting this movement was to sensitise the people about the current scenario of Thane Creek and to Clean the Creek by preventing the dumping of waste material into it as well as by treating the sewage in STPs before it is let into the creek Over the years, PDM undertook extensive surveys of the Creek, where they realized there are some spots which are rich in biodiversity. They are conducting various awareness programs to sensitize local people. In the year 2006 they took various people to Boat safari in which the people were shown how badly human activities have impacted the Creek. One such awareness program is arranging a one day seminar/ conference which involve local municipal corporations as well as college students from undergraduate and post graduate levels research students from various colleges from across the city. Dr. Sanjay Joshi ended the speech by saying "The continuous efforts of PDM team and with help of local people, various groups of leaders, students, researchers have got attached to this movement over the years and now we can truly state that this as a 'Clean Creek Movement' and it has started".

After this, Dr. Prasad Karnik, Vice President of

Dr. Sanjay Joshi presented an overview of the wetlands biodiversity.

After this the participating students were bifurcated into their respective competitions and 3 parallel sessions were organized. In a research paper session, research students and professors presented their research. The researcher and professors represented Group A while the degree students represented Group B. There were two participants in group 'A' and a total of 25 students in group 'B'. A total of 11 researchers in group 'A' and a total of 7 students in group 'B' had participated in presenting the research paper. For this, there were competitors from various places like Dehradun, Uttar Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Kolhapur. The presentation was examined by the director of the college, Dr. Usha Mukundan and Dr. Purushottam Kale for Group A and for Group B, Dr. Prasad Karnik and Dr. Pramod Salaskar was the judge. In the Poster competition, posters on different aspects of wetland were presented by students, research scholars. The judges for this competition were Shri, Hemant Karkhanis and Dr. Sasikumar Menon. A total 29 participants took part in this competition, out of which 2 were in group A and 27 in Group B. Examination of essay competition organized for school students was performed by Ms.Surabhi Walawalkar-Thosar and Dr. Sucheta Golwalkar. A total of 17 students had participated in this competition. Dr. Anil Avhad and Dr. Janhavi Bhagwat examined the short film competition on Wetlands. total of 11 students participated in this competition from various colleges, schools and by some freelancers
