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




Bio-note: Dr. Amita Valmiki is Associate Professor and Head, Department of Philosophy, Ramniranjan Jhunjhunwala College of Arts, Science and Commerce (Autonomous), (Affiliated to University of Mumbai), Ghatkopar, (West), Mumbai – 400086, and Visiting Faculty at Department of Philosophy, University of Mumbai. She was member of Board of Studies in Logic and Philosophy, University of Mumbai. Her Ph.D. thesis was on 'Man, Religion and Society' (with special reference to Mysticism). She has presented papers at various conferences, seminars and colloquiums at national and international level (more than 12 countries). She has been awarded twice post-doctoral research fellowship and has been visiting faculty at Department of Philosophy and Religious Theories at Bonn University, Germany. She has published a book titled 'Mystical Worlds: Social, Spiritual and Secular'; co-edited a book titled '100 Years of Indian Cinema: Issues and Challenges in Retrospection' and published more than 35 articles in various books and in national and international journals. She has co-organized national and international conferences and colloquiums. 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Report of Histeria

The History Association organized **Histeria**, its annual fest on January 15 and 16, 2020. On January 15, the **annual intercollegiate students research seminar** was organized on the theme *History of Indian Paintings*. Ms. Ritika Jhunjhunwala, founder of traditional art curator organization, Iteeha Foundation, was invited as Chief Guest and judge for the inaugural session. She introduced the students to the heritage of India through her talk on *The Tale of Indian Folk Paintings*. The Guest of Honour for the session was Dr. Amita Valmiki, Head, Department of Philosophy of R. Jhunjhunwala College. She spoke on *Modernism to Post Modernism in Indian Paintings: A Journey*. 7 papers were presented in this session. Afreen Khan from St. Xavier's College won first prize for her paper on Representation of Women in Ajanta Art. Wilson College students' Divya Joshi and Shrutika Wadkar's paper on *Chitrakathi* won second prize.

In the second session, Dr. Prakash Masram, Assistant Professor, Department of History, University of Mumbai was the guest of honour and judge for the second session. He delivered a talk on *Evolution and Transition of Tribal Art in India with special reference to Warli and Gond Paintings*. The session was co-judged by Prof. Deepak Poojary, Assistant Professor, Department of Zoology, R. Jhunjhunwala College. He gave a talk on *Dyes and techniques in Indian Paintings*. Students thoroughly enjoyed the beautiful demonstration of Kalamkari painting given by Prof. Poojary. 6 teams presented papers in this session. Prerana Tiwari from Jhunjhunwala College won first prize for her paper on *Cheriyal scroll paintings: An Indian story-telling tradition*. Team from Wilson College of Anamika Gupta, Rohit Gupte and Atharva Kanthi won second prize for their paper on *Gond Paintings*.

Prof. Nandita Moitra, Assistant Professor, Head, Department of History chaired the third session. She gave a talk on *Indian Nationalism and Paintings*. 7 papers were presented in this session. Esha Shetty from Jhunjhunwala College won the first prize for her paper on Jesuit Paintings while Prarthana Putharan from Ruia College won the second prize.

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In all 19 well researched papers on a range of Indian folk, tribal and modern paintings were presented at the seminar. Students enjoyed the enlightening talks by speakers, well researched papers of the participants and insightful discussions in each session.

The second day was eventful with several intra-collegiate competitions. 10 participants presented on the fascinating history of different food items of India in *Foodpedia*, a competition on history of food. Dr. Baisakhi Dutta, department of Geography, was the judge for the competition. *Awesome Attire*, historical role play competition was judged by Prof. Roseleene Zackariyas, Department of English. 8 students participated as different characters from Indian history. 20 students presented delightful works of Indian folk paintings in Bharatiya Kalakari, a painting competition. The competition was judged by Dr. Bindu Achary, Department of Zoology. Students were at their creative best in the *Radio Play competition, Parde Ke Peeche* judged by Dr. Sneha Deuskar and Prof. Sucheta Joshi. 4 teams participated in the competition. 6 participants sent creative videos on Indian heritage in *Mad About Whatsapp* Competition which was judged by Dr. Bhushan Arekar, while 5 teams competed in the adventurous treasure hunt, *Khoj Itihas Ki*. The festival aimed at creating an interest in History through these activities which blended learning with fun.
